Grants are conferred based on the assessment of the professional's genuine financial need, the potential benefit to his development and/or research and the relevance of field experience in relation to the objectives of CIMAM. When accepting the grant, each successful candidate is invited to submit an online acceptance form and to agree with the grant's Terms and Conditions.

the conference held last year in Barcelona (*The Museum and Its Responsibilities*), CIMAM believes it is imperative to re-evaluate and re-examine the roles of museums, their public functions and how they respond. Key questions include the following:

- How can national museums and art museums counter this global phenomenon of xenophobia and populism, to connect a local public with regional and international histories, perspectives and concerns?
- How can museums continue to be effective forums in society where different communities and peoples of all backgrounds and beliefs still come together, instead of retreating into parochial isolation?
- At the same time the conference will return to the mission of CIMAM and consider: Who are CIMAM's stakeholders? Who has vested interests, and what are the constituencies to whom the organisation is responsible?

Conference programme

In the course of the conference, the following issues will be addressed:

Cities: National, Supranational?

Discussions at the CIMAM 2017 Annual Conference will start by considering the role of the city on Day 1. It will consider the importance of cities for art, identity and history within the context of the national, regional, international and supranational. **Can we speak of the contemporary city as sanctuary**, **as we speak of the museum as sanctuary**? If contemporary political crises are inextricable from the politics of centres versus peripheries, can cities and the urban-international (art) elite be both the problem and the solution?

Learning from Southeast Asia

On Day 2, the conference will focus on the multifarious cultural and artistic contexts of Southeast Asia. It will look at the specificity of art museums and spaces in the region to consider their driving forces: **what are some of the positions adopted by institutions, artists and agents in this part of the world?** What are some of the lessons we can learn from Southeast Asia, a political construct as imaginary as it is intractable?

What and How do Museums Collect?

On the last day of the conference, participants will turn their attention to envision how collections can be activated to manifest their potential for civil society: **how can collections and collection strategies of museums be representative of the constituencies they are intended to serve?** How are a museum's civil responsibilities reflected in its collection, and are there national, regional or international implications?

Close to 280 delegates from over 50 countries will attend the CIMAM 2017 Annual Conference hosted by National Gallery Singapore. Held from 10 to 12 November 2017, and for the first time in Southeast Asia, the Annual Conference in Singapore is expected to be one of the largest in attendance ever.

CIMAM is the International Committee for Museums and Collections of Modern Art and its Annual Conference is a gathering of thought leaders, museum directors, curators and museum professionals from all over the world. Taking place in a different city each year, members and delegates gather to discuss and share current museological and curatorial concerns.

Extending from last year's focus in Barcelona (*The Museum and Its Responsibilities*), and seeking to address the rising sentiments of populist nationalism we are witnessing around the world, the theme for this year is *The Roles and Responsibilities of Museums in Civil Society*. The aim is also to evaluate and examine afresh the roles of museums and their public functions, reflecting on how museums can continue to be effective forums in society where different communities can share and debate differences through non-violent means.

Dr. Eugene Tan, Director of the National Gallery Singapore, CIMAM Board Member and Lead of the CIMAM 2017 conference committee said, "Premised on the concept of a public within society that perseveres for the common good and which has the ability to deliberate about it democratically, civil society is the arena for discussion and contestation of differences through non-violent means. The theme of this year's conference is particularly timely in this global climate of upheavals and uncertainty. If building a more inclusive society that embraces diversity and change requires dialogue and understanding, how museums and art can bridge gaps and bring people and perspectives together must be acknowledged and better understood. CIMAM is the global forum where issues pertinent to institutions of art are explored and debated, with far-reaching effects. I look forward to the ideas and discussions we shall be having in Singapore.

I am excited that the conference is taking part in Southeast Asia for the first time. As a national institution that has as a mission to further the understanding and appreciation of the art of Southeast Asia, it is equally important that our regional colleagues are part of the discussions on the role of museums and art institutions today. I am certain our perspectives from Southeast Asia will enrich the conversations we shall be having at the conference."





The National Gallery Singapore is set to host the 2017 International Committee for Museums and Collections of Modern Art (CIMAM) Annual Conference for three days from Nov. 10 to 12.



How can art institutions help bridge different perspectives, and expose and encourage people to dialogue?

One of the fundamental missions of all art museums and institutions is to break down the barriers and foster dialogue in our societies by presenting the art and culture of other societies that might not be familiar to a local public. However, this also extends to presenting differing perspectives within a society, so that the museum can become an inclusive and safe space for the diversity of opinions to be shared, debated and discussed. This is precisely the theme behind this year's CIMAM conference in Singapore: "The Roles and Responsibilities of Museums in Civil Society". The conference seeks to address how museums can continue to foster a 'discursive public sphere' where citizens are able to discuss freely about shared concerns in a framework underpinned by freedom, equality and non-violent interaction.

Given how civil society today is under threat from a combination of widespread economic instability, unrestrained individualism and inequality in every sphere of life, increasing government surveillance and political repression, populist nationalism and xenophobia, as well as, increasing commercialisation and consolidation of ownership of the media and other channels for free expression. What then can art museums do to counter the erosion of the public sphere in contemporary societies? Are there common ways that art and institutions develop globally to present content in a way that it is 'consumable' and understandable for different audiences? All museums and institutions have to take into account the profiles of their audiences in developing their programmes. This includes the differences in their audience demographic make up as well as the differences in the levels of art appreciation. What are the main topics discussed in CIMAM this year? Could you talk about a few highlights?

In relation to the conference theme of "The Role and Responsibilities of Museums in Civil Society," the sessions during each of the three days of the conference will examine a specific topic. The first day will look at: "Art and the City: From Local to Transnational?" – what artists, museum professionals and citizens can do to activate the public's consciousness and how they contribute to identify problems. Day 2 will focus on the region, "ReLearning Southeast Asia" – how can this region further inform our understanding of art institutions in relation to collective action and civil society, while the last day will examine the topic of collections, "What do Museums Collect, and How?" – the roles and responsibilities of the museum in respect of collecting art: how do museums determine what is 'relevant'? What is the civic

role of the collection?

The theme and topics of this year's CIMAM conference are particularly timely in this global climate of upheavals and uncertainty. If building a more inclusive society that embraces diversity and change requires dialogue and understanding, how museums and art can bridge gaps and bring people and perspectives together must be acknowledged and better understood. CIMAM is the global forum where issues pertinent to institutions of art are explored and debated, with far-reaching effects. I look forward to the ideas and discussions we shall be having in Singapore.

Rethinking the roles and responsibilities of museums to grow a more inclusive society

Rethinking the roles and responsibilities of museums to grow a more inclusive society

Speech by Ms Grace Fu, Minister for Culture, Community and Youth at the CIMAM 2017 Annual Conference 10 November 2017

Ms Elizabeth Ann Macgregor, President, CIMAM Distinguished guests; Ladies and gentlemen.

- 1. It gives me great pleasure to welcome all of you to the opening ceremony of CIMAM's annual conference.
- 2. We are delighted and honoured to host CIMAM's first conference in Southeast Asia, since its inception in 1962.

A diverse cultural landscape can shape a better society

- 3. We gather in a time of global uncertainty, where societies are becoming increasingly complex, polarised and divided, because of perceived differences. We are not immune to these forces in Singapore and Southeast Asia. Nonetheless, we are also home to a confluence of civilisations which for centuries have co-existed side-by-side, and have created a unique blend of cultures.
- 4. I believe that this **diversity is a source of strength**. It gives us a deep well to draw from, when seeking ideas and inspiration to meet the challenges of a modern, cosmopolitan society. Home to many cultures, Singapore celebrates our diversity through our arts and heritage offerings. These provide platforms for us to express different views, exchange perspectives, build mutual empathy and understanding, and thereby shape a better society.

Rethinking the roles and responsibilities of museums to shape a more resilient and harmonious society

5. I would like to offer some perspectives on what we can do in this area, as we believe that museums can play an important role in impacting and improving the lives of our people. I would like to share my views along three areas – curation, spaces and partnerships.

Curation that encourage conversations

- 6 . <u>First</u>, museums could curate their collections in a manner that creates conversations and deepens understanding among different communities. An example of a conversation that spanned both the local and transnational dimensions would be National Gallery Singapore's (Gallery) "Artist and Empire: (En)countering Colonial Legacies" exhibition which ran from last October to March this year. This drew on Singapore's National Collection to extend the narrative from Tate Britain's "Artist and Empire". Gallery's addition provided perspectives from former colonies in this region, and included responses to colonialism by contemporary artists. For instance, the painting of the British bulldog, on the extreme right is by Singaporean artist Tang Da Wu. Titled "You see No Sunset on your soil, I saw your Son Sat on my paddy field", the bulldog represents the waning of the British Empire, and marks a distinct post-colonial mood in the 1980s. This exhibition was complemented by public programmes that encouraged discourse, and explored the relationship between art, power and identity.
- 7. Our museums have also incorporated inter-generational dialogue as part of their exhibition narrative. The exhibition on World War Two at the National Museum of Singapore (National Museum), "Witness to War: Remembering 1942" is a case in point. The exhibition features six out of 50 oral interviews with local war survivors, conducted by school students as part of the Student Archivist Project. This helped to generate empathy and respect for the experiences of the older generation, and provided a bridge to make history more relevant and accessible to younger audiences. I hope that this is something that more families will experience, during the upcoming celebration of Grandparents' Day on 25 November, at the National Museum.

Spaces that welcome diverse audiences

- 8. <u>Second</u>, we can **make our museum spaces more accessible and attractive for diverse audiences**. We have invested much in upgrading Singapore's cultural infrastructure in recent years. This allows us to bring more cultural offerings and improve on physical accessibility. From designated parking spaces to restrooms for persons with disabilities, our institutions have incorporated universal design and made their spaces more barrier-free.
- 9. The National Museum, Asian Civilisations Museum and The Peranakan Museum have customised guided programmes for seniors and visitors with special needs. The National Heritage Board, which manages these museums, is also looking into how programming can make our museum spaces more attractive and meaningful for underserved groups, such as lower income families. We see this as a very important social objective, that having invested large sums of money in our cultural institutions, they must relate to all segments of the population.
- 10. Many of Singapore's museums also have programmes designed for children. For example, in its inaugural Children's Biennale from May to October this year, Gallery installed interactive artworks in its public spaces, and transformed the entire museum into a learning space for young audiences. By moving beyond the traditional confines of an exhibition space, it succeeded in making the museum more inviting for children and their parents. In fact, the PAP Community Foundation (PCF), which is an anchor operator that offers pre-school education to the masses at affordable fees, chose the Gallery as the venue of their Family Day. Almost 10,000 people, including children from over 360 PCF preschools, had a day of fun with the artworks and activities.

Partnerships that amplify impact

- 11. <u>Third</u>, beyond collaborations with cultural professionals, we need to draw on resources and capabilities beyond the conventional cultural sector to amplify our impact. This is especially pertinent, as the breakneck speed of technological revolution and proliferation of media platforms, compel us to tap expertise beyond the cultural sector, in order to stay relevant.
- 12. Museums all over the world are exploring partnerships that harness the use of technology, to provide new offerings and attract a wider audience. Through its partnership with PRESENCE Pictures, a local start-up specialising in creating virtual reality content, the National Museum inspired its young audiences through an art-meets-tech programme. As part of this, children drew their imaginary future museum and cartoon Museum Buddy, animated it using their own body movements, and interacted with their final artworks in virtual reality.
- 13. Such co-creation opportunities, with partners outside the cultural sector, have certainly helped our cultural agencies extend their sphere of influence. For example, the National Heritage Board partnered the National University of Singapore's Keio-NUS CUTE Centre to launch a heritage trail app in May last year, to consolidate all our heritage trails, onto a single platform. With over 80 trails to choose from, the public can embark on their self-guided journeys, discover stories behind the streets and landmarks in Singapore, and share their trail experiences with other users.

Conclusion

- 14. These are some of my thoughts on how our museums can play a more significant role in growing a more resilient and harmonious society. Underpinning all these possible initiatives are the people who serve as cultural leaders in each of our countries. Their professional growth and development are instrumental to achieving our social objectives. With this in mind, we established the Culture Academy in 2015 to groom the next generation of cultural leaders, professionals and administrators. Some of its programmes include monthly curatorial talks which are open to the public; and the Distinguished Speaker Series, which has featured cultural leaders, such as Dr Neil MacGregor, the former British Museum Director and Mr Jack Lang, the former French Minister for Culture and Education.
- 15. Beyond this, we are always looking for opportunities to learn from the best. This conference is thus opportune, in enabling us to engage with museum experts from around the world. We hope that you will find some time to visit our museums and galleries, and share with us your advice and suggestions. Once again, we warmly welcome members of CIMAM and wish you a fruitful meeting in Singapore.

Kurator Dunia Kagumi Koleksi Seni Rupa Indonesia

MAGELANG, KOMPAS.com - Sebanyak 48 pecinta seni rupa dari 25 negara di dunia mengunjungi Oei Hong Dijen (OHD) Museum Kota Magelang, Jawa Tengah, Selasa (14/11/2017).

Mereka merupakan peserta The 2017 Annual Conference of the International Committee for Museums and Collections of Modern Art (CIMAM) di Singapura yang digelar 10 hingga 12 November 2017 lalu.





Kedatangan mereka ke museum yang terletak di Jalan Jenggolo, Kota Magelang, itu adalah kebanggaan tersendiri bagi pengelola OHD Museum. Betapa tidak, para peserta bukan sekadar pecinta, tetapi juga tokoh-tokoh yang memiliki peran dalam perkembangan seni rupa di negara masing-masing.

Dr Oei Hong Djien, pemilik OHD Museum, menyebut para tamu istimewa itu merupakan direktur, pengelola, hingga kurator seni rupa dari 25 negara tersebut. Antara lain Jay A Levenson, direktur Program Internasional Museum of Modern Art (MoMA) New York City, Amerika Serikat.

Kemudian, Elizabeth Ann Macgregor, direktur Museum of Contemporary Art Sidney, Australia, yang merupakan Presiden CIMAM. Elizabeth sekaligus menjadi pimpinan rombongan ini ke Indonesia, termasuk ke Magelang.

"Tidak hanya kami (pengelola OHD Museum), Magelang semestinya bangga dengan kedatangan mereka. Karena ini kesempatan untuk mengenalkan Magelang dan seni rupa Indonesia ke negara-negara lain, gratis pula," ujar Oel, usai kegiatan.

Oei menjelaskan, selama sekitar satu jam, mereka berkeliling dan melihat koleksi seni rupa yang ada di OHD museum. Pada saat yang sama, di museum tersebut masih berlangsung pameran seni rupa bertajuk "Linkage" dalam rangka ulang tahun ke-20 OHD Museum.

"Kami memiliki 51 koleksi seni rupa karya seniman Indonesia, modern maupun kontemporer. Kami sampaikan apa saja tentarig koleksi kami, termasuk perkembangan seni rupa Indonesia," ungkapnya.

Lebih lanjut, setiap tahun CIMAM mengadakan konferensi di berbagai negara. Tahun ini, Singapura menjadi negara pertama di Asia Tenggara yang ditunjuk menjadi tuan rumah.

"CIMAM merupakan konferensi bergengsi bagi para pengelola, direktur, dan kurator museum di dunia. CIMAM pertama diadakan di Den Haag Belanda tahun 1962, dan baru pertama kali diadakan di Asia Tenggara dengan Singapura sebagai tuan rumah," katanya.

Tamu yang datang ke OHD Museum ini, katanya, hanya sebagian dari total peserta CIMAM yang berjumlah 280 orang dari 50 negara. Mereka yang datang ke OHD Museum berasal dari Amerika, Meksiko, Argentina, Inggris, Jerman, Perancis, Belanda, Belgia, Spanyol, Ukraina, Rusia, Polandia, Jepang, India, Turki, dan lainnya.

Selain ke OHD Museum, mereka juga mengunjungi Candi Borobudur, Yogyakarta, dan Jakarta. Di Yogyakarta mereka menghadiri Jogja Biennale XIV tahun 2017.

"Mereka sangat terkesan dengan kita. Mereka banyak bertanya karena sebagian mereka baru pertama datang ke Indonesia khususnya Magelang. Mereka tidak menyangka kita memiliki banyak museum dengan beragam koleksi dari seni rupa, kriya, hingga benda-benda bersejarah," pungkas OHD.
